## **UPDATE ON THE B. P. O. EIKS (NATIONAL) LIQUOR LIABILITY INSURANCE**

**Watch for news on a possible contract resolution, in the July Delta Rag.**

On May 15, 2019 your SJDJS Treasurer Geri Eckert and Ye Editor Pee Pee met with the Board of Directors of the Stockton Elks Club. The subject of the meeting was our 2019-2020 Rental Contract. Contained therein is a Liquor Liability Insurance mandate, as required by the BPOE National Office. The Stockton BOD was very understanding of the financial impact this insurance mandate has on us. The insurance requirement amounts to \$165 for every Sunday SJDJS Session. Putting that in perspective, that is a 50% increase in our "Housing Budget."

We agreed that **this insurance requirement is coming from Elks National Office and is not something that the Stockton BPOE has done.** We reached agreement that we could table the signing of our rental contract until mid-June. At that time, their Insurance Officer (Frank Chicago) will have had time to review our Liability Insurance policy. It is our hope (***also expressed by the Stockton BPOE Board***) that our current policy will satisfy the liability insurance requirement of the National BPOE.

We are in consultation with our SJDJS liability insurance agent. We are instructing our Liability Insurance agent to send Frank Chicago at the BPOE Stockton a complete copy (115 pages) of our Liability Insurance policy. We currently have a blanket liability policy that names the Stockton BPOE as "Also Insured." This, in effect, holds them harmless from liability and provides them the same coverage we have for our events. In addition, since we do not serve alcoholic beverages, we do not have any Liquor Liability. The Stockton Elks Club is the exclusive liquor server at our sessions. They are the only ABC Liquor License holder for our events. We pay the Stockton BPOE a \$25 ABC License Fee each month to offset their license cost.

**A second item: Our Regular SJDJS Meeting will be on Sunday, December 1, 2019.** The BPOE Board agreed to our rental date being the First Sunday of the Month. We were able to resolve that issue with the Stockton BPOE at this meeting. The proposed rental contract had changed our meeting date in December to the 8th. For many years, we were changed to the Second Sunday in December. The Stockton BPOE Memorial Services are always held in the morning on the First Sunday in December. We reminded the BPOE Board that we changed that arrangement at least 5 years ago, so we could continue to always meet on the First Sunday of every month. We have agreed to wait to set up on that First December Sunday until their services concluded (around noon). This made a little later start for our session but was preferable to a day/date change. That system has worked well for the SJDJS and for the BPOE.

***Our personal opinion:*** The Board of Directors of the Stockton Elks Club is very understanding and willing to work with us to resolve the rental contract issues. The liability insurance requirement is beyond their local control. They totally understand the financial impact the requirement places on the SJDJS. FYI: We have been at the Stockton Elks Club since the beginning of the SJDJS. Over those 41 years, we have paid rent that amounts to almost \$250,000 (*That's a quarter of a million dollars folks!*) We are good customers and good tenants and the Stockton BPOE appreciates us!

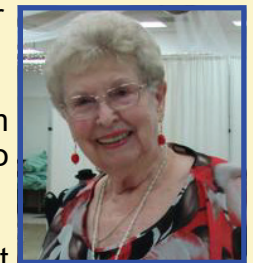

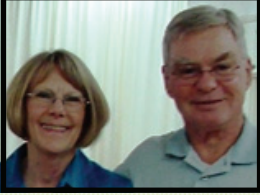

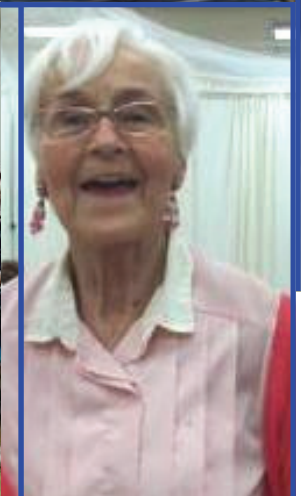
