#### MUSIC DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This is to let the jam musicians know some of the policies that will be in effect.

- 1) If you call in advance of the club meeting to let me know you would like to reserve a place in a set, be advised that your reservation will apply only if you show up before the set starts. If you are late, the set will start with a replacement musician, and you will be assigned to the next available jam set.
- 2) When there are multiple musicians on the same instrument, then beginning with the last available set, the set will be divided between 2 players, time-wise (generally close to the 20 minute mark). However, with the permission of both players, both can share the entire set together.
- 3) Jammers that are on the same set: Try to get together and select your tune list and keys before you get on stage, so you can easily transition from one tune to the next. Don't waste your playing time making those decisions on stage.
- 4) Think about cutting the solos down to 3 per song. If you count one ensemble at the beginning, 3 solos, and 1 ensemble out, that's 5 times through a song, which is plenty. This means that if you take a solo on one song, perhaps you don't do so on the next. Sit it out, solo-wise.
- 5) If a song is long (especially if it is slow) then split the song in the middle when taking solos. For example, the song "Georgia."
- 6) Singers: Arrange to let the band know the songs you will be singing, and in what keys, before the band goes on stage. Band leaders: if you will have a singer, know what songs and keys will be sung before you begin the set. If this is not done, some of the longest non-musical moments on stage are spent discussing those things.
